ENTRY GUIDELINES:

- Entries must be made by students in grades 7-12
- Artwork must be 2D and no larger than 28" x 28" x 4" including the frame and cannot weigh more than 15lbs (only the winning entry will need to be framed)
- Each entry must be original in concept, design, and execution and may not violate any U.S. copyright laws
- Artwork will be hung in Cannon Tunnel for one year and may not be returned to the student earlier
- Artwork must adhere to the policy of the House Office Building Commission
- Accepted media: paintings (oil, acrylics, watercolor, etc.), drawings (pastels, colored pencil, pencil, charcoal, ink, and markers), collage, print (lithographs, silk screen, block prints), mixed media (use of more than two medias), computer-generated art, and photography
