Dear Chairman Womack and Ranking Member Quigley,

I am requesting \$2 million in funding for the City of Tucson's Stone and Speedway Affordable and Mixed Income Transit Oriented Housing Development project fiscal year 2025.

The funding will be used for pre-development activities including site analysis, site preparation, design, or community engagement and for gap funding for the construction of the Transit Oriented Housing Development (TOD). Construction funding will include support features including sidewalks, streetscape improvements, podium parking, water, sewer, and other utility service improvements necessary.

Affordable Housing is one of the most important investments of public funding as housing is essential for family stability. This funding will be leveraged by significant additional investment. The Speedway and Stone Housing Development is a crucial project intersecting multiple high-priority goals for the City of Tucson by providing affordable housing to a mix of incomes from extremely low-income to workforce and middle-income households.
