# **KNOW YOUR RIGHTS IF ICE STOPS YOU IN PUBLIC**

All people living in the United States, regardless of immigration status, have certain Constitutional rights. Be informed of the following:

## **Rights When Stopped by ICE Officers**

- Right to Remain Silent: You do not need to answer questions or provide information.
- **Right to Refuse a Search:** You can decline a search of yourself or belongings, but officers may conduct a pat-down if they suspect a weapon.
- Right to Speak to a Lawyer: If detained, you have the right to immediately contact a lawyer.

## **Asserting Your Rights**

- Ask if you are free to leave.
- Remain silent and request to speak to a lawyer.
- Refuse to answer questions about your birthplace or entry into the U.S.
- Do not show false documents or lie.
- Show a know-your-rights card to assert your rights.
- Request a list of pro bono lawyers if you do not have one.

Stay calm, know your rights, and assert them confidently.
